Earth Day is April 22, a day that celebrates efforts to protect the environment. Some easy ways to get involved:

- Motor vehicles are the cause of most of the emissions that cause smog in Southern California. To encourage people to choose an alternative to driving alone, rides will be free all day on **Metrolink, Metro Bus and Rail, OC Bus, Riverside Transit Agency** buses and micro transit, as well as all **San Bernardino County** and **Ventura County** transit providers.

Metro Rail Extension to Beverly Hills Opening Soon



The first section of the **D (Purple) Line Extension** will open on **May 8**. The

3.9-mile corridor includes three new stations along Wilshire Boulevard, serving Los Angeles' Miracle Mile district

to La Cienega Boulevard in Beverly Hills.

This will be the first time that rail transit has ever reached Wilshire Boulevard west of Western Avenue, currently the end of the D Line.

Travel times between Union Station in downtown L.A. and the Wilshire/La Cienega station will be about 20 minutes.

Feeling the Pinch at the Pump?

The recent spike in gas prices is giving many commuters sticker shock at the pump. Even worse, California's gas prices are on average the highest in the nation, according to AAA, surpassing \$5 a gallon as of mid-March.
